Our Distinguished Faculty

Richard E. Gardiner is in private practice in Fairfax, Virginia. Mr. Gardiner's practice emphasizes criminal defense in federal and state courts. He was co-counsel in the Supreme Court case of *Printz v. United States*, 117 S.Ct. 2365 (1997), which held unconstitutional provisions of the Brady Act. Mr. Gardiner has briefed and argued criminal and civil appeals in the U.S. Courts of Appeal for the 4th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 11th, District of Columbia and Federal Circuits (including three *en banc* appeals), and in the Virginia Supreme Court and Virginia Court of Appeals. He has been lead counsel in more than 60 trials (jury and non-jury, involving pre-trial motions and hearings) in state and federal court (felony, misdemeanor, civil), and in more than a dozen federal and state administrative hearings. Mr. Gardiner has testified before committees of Congress and the Virginia General Assembly. He is a director and treasurer of the Virginia Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers. Until 1994, Mr. Gardiner was legislative counsel for the National Rifle Association, where he was responsible for analyzing and drafting federal, state and local legislation relating to criminal law, elections and lobbying. He also served NRA's spokesman on national television programs (including "Today Show," "McNeil-Lehrer Report," "CBS This Morning," "Sunday Morning" and "Crossfire"), on radio and in print media (including *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *L.A. Times*, *Philadelphia Inquirer* and *Boston Globe*). Prior to being legislative counsel, Mr. Gardiner was the director of NRA's state and local affairs, where he was responsible for directing NRA's lobbying efforts at the state and local level.

John I. Harris is of counsel to Schulman, LeRoy & Bennett, PC, and maintains his law practice in Nashville, Tennessee. He handles a variety of civil, administrative and criminal law matters in Tennessee and the Southeast. Mr. Harris graduated from Vanderbilt University and obtained his law degree from Vanderbilt School of Law. As a compliment to his law practice, he serves as the executive director of the Tennessee Firearms Association, Inc., as a legal consultant for the NRA-ILA's lobbyist in Tennessee and he is also the registered lobbyist for the Tennessee Firearms Association Legislative Action Committee. Mr. Harris has also served as the general counsel to the Tennessee Sheriffs' Association since 1996. He lectures in Tennessee on the topics of Tennessee's firearms laws and the civilian use of deadly force. Mr. Harris' most recent publication in the area of firearms law is "Carrying a Handgun for Self Defense In Tennessee" (3rd Edition 2003), which is available through the Tennessee Firearms Association at www.tennesseefirearms.com.
